"This program provides tools, concepts, frameworks and

critical thinking as well as practical hands-on, experiential learning in areas such as leadership, strategic planning and managing change as a senior leader."

"We are thrilled at the prospect of being able to invest in the future of the food industry in a way that is both meaningful and personal to those who have chosen to embark on an exciting academic journey," said Carole Christianson, Chief Operating Officer for the WAFC. "There are many people in the food industry who've always dreamed of going back to school but never had the wherewithal to realize that dream.
